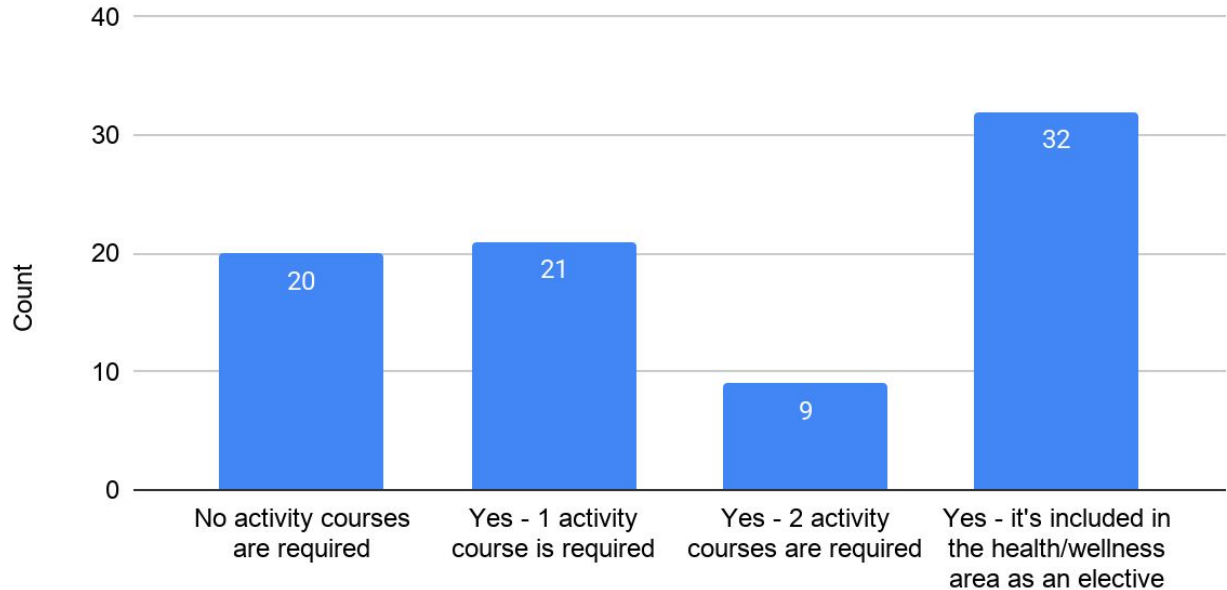
What is going on?

Duplicate responses from the same college to the survey were removed. Results are based off of individual responses and may not fully reflect current course offerings, campus policies, or approvals.



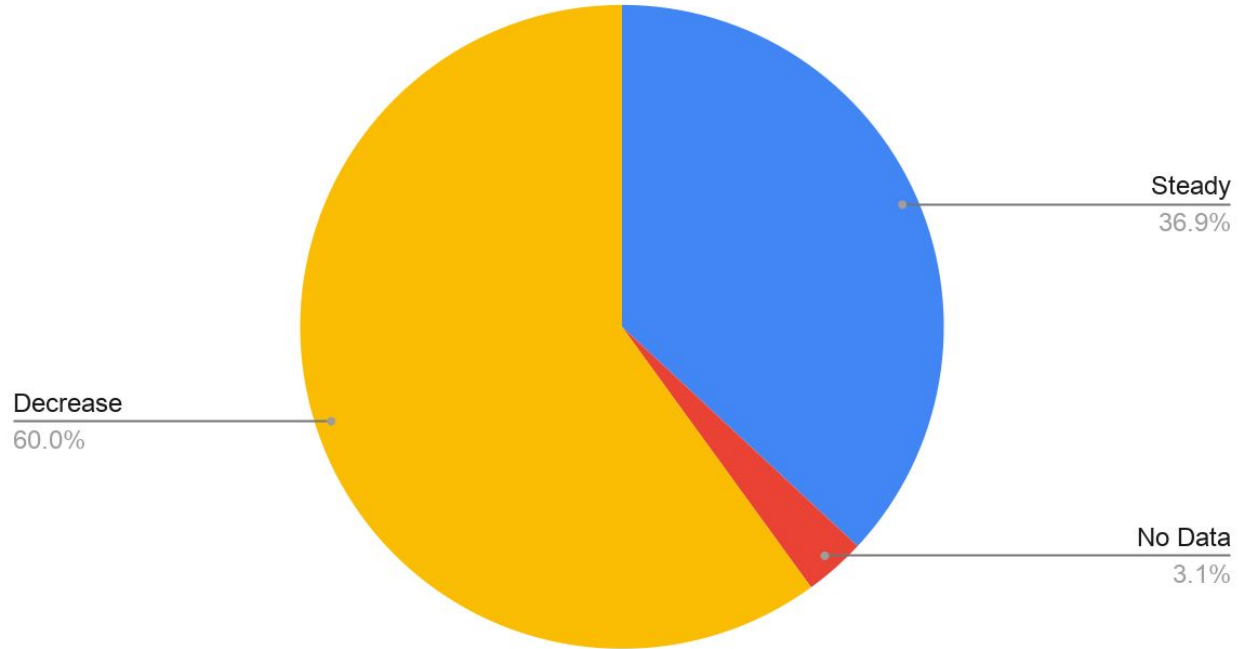
Does your college have activity courses as a requirement in your local degree?

Specific Enrollment Losses Reported by Colleges

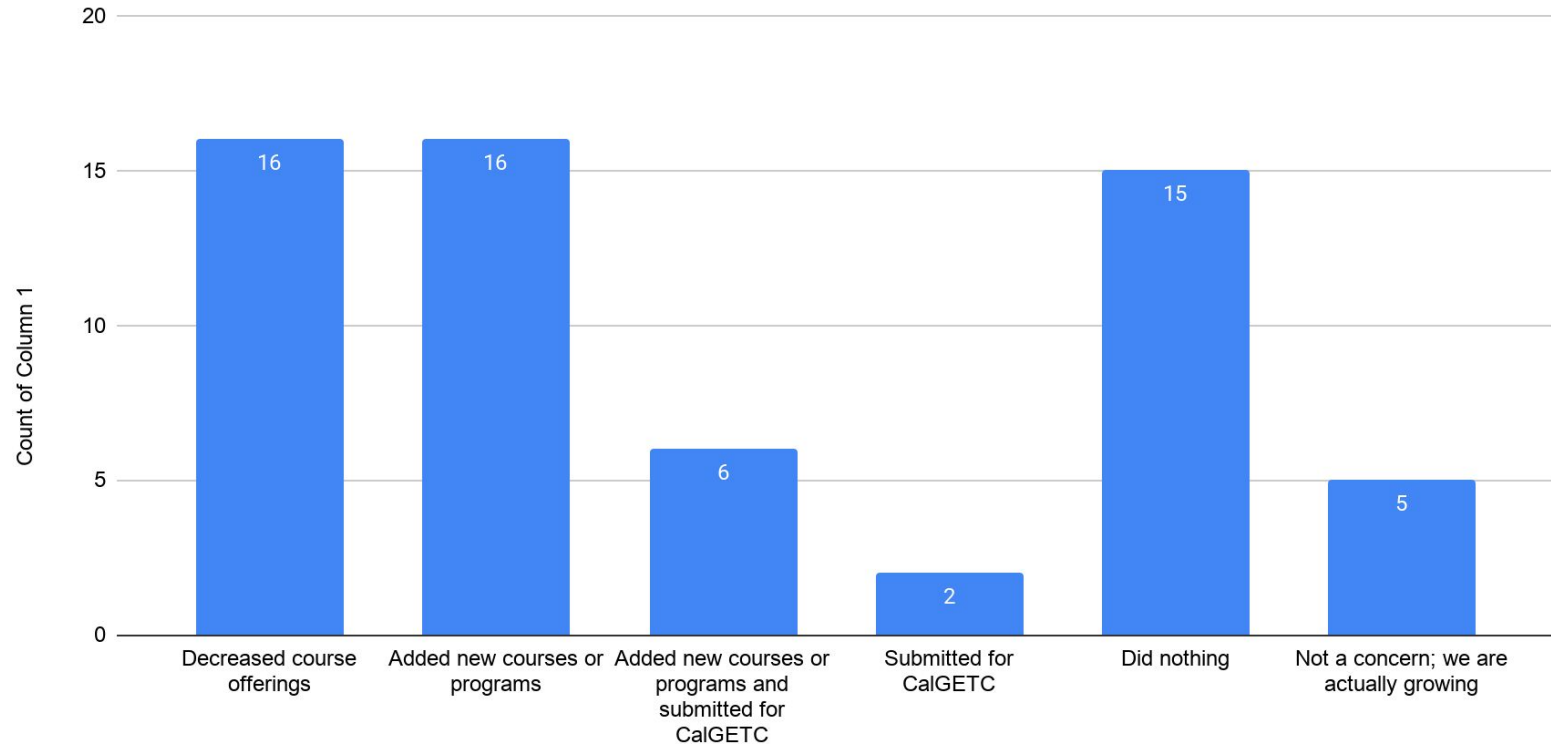
Hardest hit:

- Activity classes
- In-person classes

College	Reported Decline
Cerritos College	Personal Health down 66%, Intro to KIN down 30%, PE down 35%
Cabrillo College	Teaching unit allocation cut by 12%
College of the Canyons	Health 100 Online sections canceled for first time ever
East LA College	KIN/Health disciplines decreased; activity classes hardest hit
Foothill College	Struggling to replace lost enrollment; daytime in-person classes most impacted
Chaffey College	District forcing all areas to lower course offerings due to budget
Grossmont College	Enrollment down; sections cut; department restructuring underway
Las Positas College	FTEF cut; only 1 adjunct professor remaining in division
Coastline College	Almost all courses declined across the board

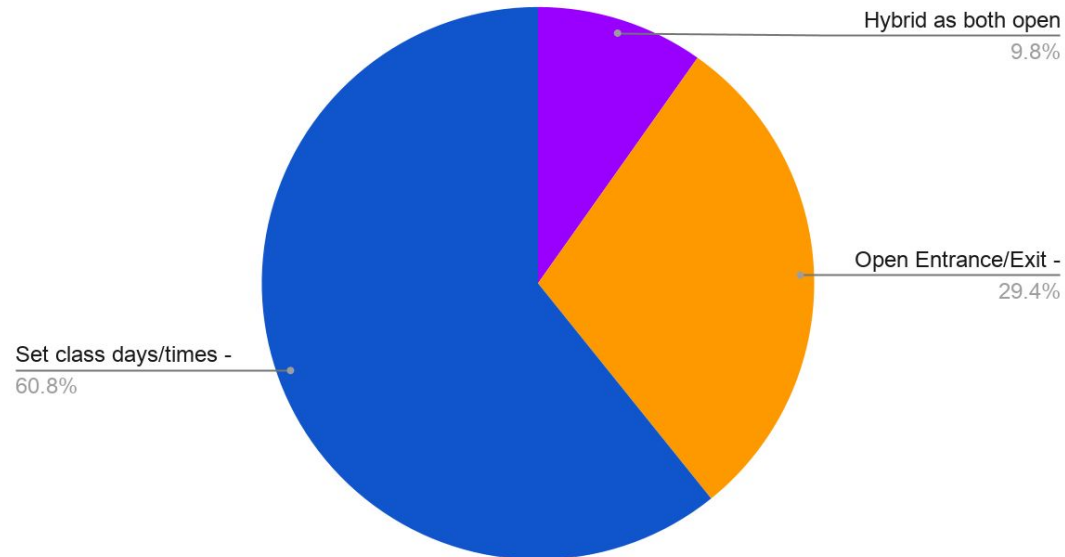

Department Demographics



15 colleges have 3 or fewer Full-Time faculty

34 colleges have between 4 and 10 Full-Time faculty

14 colleges have over 10 Full-Time faculty and 1 college reported 20 FT

- Some of these are also head coaches

Part time faculty range between 3 and 55 and include athletic coaches

Most coaches (~40) are faculty, but 2 colleges indicated coaches are only professional experts and 10 indicated that some coaches are faculty and some are administrators, classified, or professionals
